

MITCHELL TAYLOR WORKSHOP WINS AJ SMALL PROJECTS 2009

Mitchell Taylor Workshop has won the 2009 AJ Small Projects Awards, sponsored by Ramboll Whitbybird, with its £150,000 self-build extension to Moonshine, an 18th-century building in Bath.

The corrugated sheet-clad addition was constructed with components that had to be carried by hand along a woodland path.

The practice picked up the \pounds 1,000 award – open to projects with a contract value of less than \pounds 250,000 – at a ceremony last week (*see Astragal, page 16*). The awards were judged by AJ editor Kieran Long, John Boxall of quantity surveyor Jackson Coles and Simon Smith of

Ramboll Whitbybird. Second prize of £750 went to Dualchas Building Design for The Shed on the Isle of Skye a £195,000 larch-clad house. Third prize of £500 went to Burd Haward Architects for its two-storey lift extension. Highly commended (£250) was the £9,500 Timber Room by Unit 7 of London Metropolitan University. Ramboll Whitbybird's Community Award went to Voluntary Design and Build's Tarlungeni Children's Centre in Brasov, Romania.

The shortlisted entries will be exhibited at New London Architecture, London WC1, until 26 February. *Richard Waite*
